Below are some study questions that will help you and your Life Group dig deeper into this weekend's sermon. We've included plenty of questions, but feel free to use just a few or to choose whichever questions best fit your group.

Bible Questions:

1. Read Romans 5:1-5
 - a. Ask group members to read the passage again on their own. Give them 5 minutes to sit in the passage and make note of anything that stands out to them. What do you notice in this passage? What can we learn from this passage? What does this passage teach us about God? Then share your thoughts as a group.

Application Questions:

1. Tom began by sharing of a recent article he read regarding the "Death-switch" service which sends emails to people upon your death.
 - a. If you were to use that service – who would you send an email to?
 - b. What would it say?
2. Tom encouraged us that we have work to do while on earth and that we don't have forever to do it. What has God been asking you to do that you may have been putting off?
 - a. What is one action step you can take soon to begin moving towards that goal?
3. How were you inspired by hearing or reading the story of Blythe and "Dressember"?
4. Thinking with a legacy mind gives us a clear picture of the end and helps define our current priorities.
 - a. What are some things that you are currently prioritizing that may not feel as important in the end?
 - b. How will you prioritize differently in the future?
5. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-20.
 - a. What does it mean to you that we are Christ's ambassadors? And how will you live differently based on this understanding?

Closing & Prayer: *[set aside 10-20 minutes for prayer]*

Ask the group to close their eyes and get in a comfortable position. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-20 once again over the group and invite them to reflect on its meaning for their lives. Pray for the things shared in your group. Pray that the Holy Spirit would be affirming a greater sense of purpose and calling in our lives and that He would open doors into how we are to step out in those callings.
