## Overflow

It Starts With Believing.

Jesus was once in a conversation with a group of people who asked Him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?"

Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent." (John 6:28-29)

Jesus is clear about the primacy and centrality of faith. Christians are primarily called "believers," not "achievers." The way that we achieve is by first believing. And what we believe about God, ourselves, and others determines how we act towards God, ourselves, and others. In this way, a genuine belief in Jesus doesn't just stay as a belief or trust in Him. It is designed to bubble up and overflow from our lives to those around us. As Romans 15:13 says, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Since its founding in 1907 as a little home Bible study in Los Angeles, Christian Assembly has been a place where Jesus graciously calls people to believe in Him. As people from every generation and ethnicity respond to the gospel of Jesus, we are indeed seeing God fill us abundantly, so that we overflow with the hope of the good news of Christ. Locally, we now have 33 different partnerships where these streams of the hope of the gospel are flowing. Globally, it's currently flowing into 29 different countries, including impacting 35 unreached people

groups. And everywhere it is flowing, we see signs of life: the gospel is being shared, people are being saved, disciples are being made, lives are being restored, and goodness is coming in too many ways to count—all of this done from the overflow of believing in Jesus, the one whom God has sent.

In these pages, you will get to go beyond the numbers to the many stories of changed lives from the overflow of the belief of those who call Christian Assembly home. Without your faith, prayers, serving, and financial giving, none of these stories would be happening. I hope the stories and partnerships inspire and encourage you as much as they do me. May God use them to invite you to do the work of God: to believe in Jesus for the first time—or maybe to believe again—and then let that belief overflow from your life too.

### KIDS HOPE

## Andy & Alejandro's Story by Sarah Dornbos

When we began our Kids Hope mentoring program at Eagle Rock Elementary (ERE) in January of 2008, the first student referred to us was a second-grader named Alejandro. Struggling with behavior issues at school, Alejandro was matched with Andy Balch, a CA volunteer mentor, who met with him for an hour each week over the next five years.

When the two started meeting, Alejandro was missing academic instruction due to behavior, and Andy didn't have any special behavior modification training. However, after just a few weeks of mentoring, Alejandro's teacher, Ms. Oliva, reached out to me and asked, "What are you doing during Kids Hope?"

I explained to her that we try to "go FAR." We do something fun, something academic, and something relational each time we meet. For Andy and Alejandro, that meant playing a lot of basketball, reading together each week, and talking about Alejandro's frustrations about fairness in school. "Whatever you're doing, keep it up," Ms. Oliva encouraged me. "Alejandro's spending a lot more time in my classroom—and not in the principal's office—because he wants to impress Andy with a good behavior report on Tuesdays."

The simple act of someone coming to school each week and checking in on Alejandro met a need that was crying out in his heart, resulting in a positive behavior change all week. This is not uncommon in our Kids Hope classroom. Ordinary people from our church show up week after week, and change the trajectory of a child's life.

When Alejandro graduated from sixth grade in 2012, that was a huge win. So you can imagine my delight in April of 2024 when

Alejandro's mom invited me to another graduation—this time from the Los Angeles Police Academy. As I cheered Alejandro on, I marveled at the redemptive work of God in the life of a little boy who struggled with behavior in school—now a police officer in Northeast Los Angeles, including the neighborhood where both the school and church campuses are located!

Even more, God used Kids Hope to draw Alejandro's family into a relationship with Himself. As the pastor from their Spanish-speaking church in Highland Park prayed a prayer of protection over Alejandro at his graduation, I thought of Brian Taylor and Bob Walsh, prayer partners who prayed weekly for Andy and Alejandro for those five years that they were part of Kids Hope.

Alejandro's mom shared with us, "Andy impacted my son's life in so many ways. The love that Kids Hope gives to children changes their lives, and if we parents make an effort to have Christ in their lives and ours, God does wonders like what He has done with my son. You're not just impacting the student, but the family, and the whole community through Kids Hope."

#### **Expanding Partnerships**

Alejandro's second grade teacher retired from LAUSD a few years ago. After seeing the positive impact of Kids Hope at her school, Ms. Oliva knew she wanted to be part of transforming the lives of children through Kids Hope. Ms. Oliva is now a Kids Hope director at her son-in-law's church in Chatsworth, CA.

# Making the Presence of Jesus Known

Halfway through the school year, a Young Life leader at Herbert Hoover High School shared a moving testimony. A parent told the leader that she had started reading the Bible for the first time in over 20 years. Inspired by her daughter, who had organized Bible studies for her friends after attending our Young Life Club during lunch, this woman's story highlights the transformative impact of Young Life's presence on campus.

For almost 20 years, Glendale hasn't had a Young Life presence. However, the 2023-2024 school year changed everything. We now have a thriving Young Life Club at Hoover High School. This wouldn't have been possible if several people hadn't acted

on the movement of the Holy Spirit. By God's gracious guidance the leadership committee was formed, and we got to work. After some networking meetings, we met two people at Hoover High School who wanted to start a Young Life Club.

The Hoover High Young Life Lunch Club has seen around 150 students come through our doors and hear the gospel this year. We've averaged 40 to 50 students weekly, many of whom are hearing the gospel for the first time. We've also started weekly Campaigners gatherings (Bible studies), which meet on Wednesdays during lunch. Many students shared about how the Lunch Club has gotten them to read the Bible for the first time or draw closer to God throughout the school year.

Our goal is to establish a presence at every high school and junior high school in Glendale, as well as at Glendale Community College (GCC). In the 2024-2025 school year, we plan to start an after-school Glendale Young Life Club and introduce lunch clubs at Glendale High School and a club at GCC. We are committed to making the presence of Jesus known in Glendale.





### FCA IN THE SAN FERNANDO VALLEY

## For the Win

Josh Brodt works with athletes and coaches in the San Fernando Valley as the Area Representative for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA). The Valley is a diverse space, so Josh works with a diverse group of student athletes, all for the purpose of "leading every coach and athlete into a growing relationship with Jesus Christ and His church." Erick Quintanilla and Victor Garcia are two of those athletes and new student leaders for FCA at Vaughn High School.

Over the 2023-2024 school year, both Erick and Victor grew tremendously in their faith due to their consistent attendance at FCA huddles and Bible studies, often asking good questions and engaging in deep conversations with the adult leaders. At one of the huddles, Erick courageously shared his testimony about God providing for him and his family after his father passed away from Covid. Josh and the adult leaders were very proud of Erick for stepping out in faith in this way.

Victor took big strides in his faith as well, and he plans to attend FCA's first high school summer camp since before the pandemic. At these camps, FCA aims to host an exciting time of inspiration and perspiration, where athletes get high level instruction in their sport and in the Word of God. Josh looks forward to cheering on Victor and several other Vaughn High School athletes who have already signed up.

This year, FCA also hosted many successful competitive events on campuses throughout the Valley—from basketball and dodgeball tournaments, to capture the flag, to several flag football tournaments. All of these were run with the help of student leaders like Erick and Victor, as well as coaches and volunteers. Student leaders gathered even more students at the huddles after the tournaments concluded.

For FCA, sports is a vehicle for the gospel. Josh and the coaches, volunteers, student leaders, and guest speakers gave away



close to 100 Bibles and shared the gospel on campuses across the Valley through FCA Huddles this year. At least seven students made first-time commitments to Jesus, and all 28 FCA student leaders in the Valley took meaningful steps to deepen their faith this school year. Since 2015, close to 5,000 students have made decisions to follow Christ through FCA's campus huddles in the San Fernando Valley. That is what FCA calls a win.

The first time Dylan came to Young Life Club he talked about the kind and energetic leaders and how much he enjoyed hearing about God. As he continued to be involved with Young Life, Dylan's hunger to know God grew. He started asking questions and decided to get serious about his faith. Through mentorship from our Young Life leaders, attending Campaigners (a Bible study), and going to Winter Camp, Dylan's faith and passion for God took off.

Some of our Young Life leaders started taking Dylan and some other unchurched students to CA Students at Christian Assembly. He loved the worship and the caring community

at CA, as well as the powerful messages from the Bible. Dylan just graduated from High School, but he plans to attend Fusion (CA's young adult service) in the fall.

He shares, "Young Life has been amazing, because I have grown with the Lord and have learned about His Word. I have connected with others who have an amazing relationship with Jesus. Christian Assembly is great for people who have just started learning about Jesus and want to know more about Him. God is the most amazing Heavenly Father ever, and our Lord and Savior."

As we connect our unchurched students to churches, we have seen family members also start to come to church. One of our students received Jesus at Winter Camp and began attending 678 (CA's middle school ministry). A few months later, his mom began a relationship with Jesus while attending a Sunday morning service at CA. In Dylan's own words, praise to "the most amazing Heavenly Father ever, and our Lord and Savior!"

#### **More About Duarte Monrovia Young Life**

Last year Duarte Monrovia Young Life was nominated as one of the fastest growing areas of Young Life in the Southwest Region. We are currently on four public school campuses in the Duarte/ Monrovia area, loving each student and sharing the gospel during lunch. In the past year around 22 students began a relationship with Jesus, and our 30 leaders now know over 350 students by

We took 130+ students to Young Life Summer Camp—more than double the number of students we took last year. Six of our high school students have become leaders for Wyldlife (Young Life's middle school ministry), and six student leaders at Duarte High School are leading Young Life Club on their own campus. We know that God loves each student, and we celebrate the ways they have experienced His love and presence this past year!

Seeking solace and escape through a life of promiscuity, alcohol, and psychedelic drugs, Ryan quickly spiraled into cycles of guilt and shame.

He eventually hit rock bottom midway through his junior year, but soon remembered that his childhood neighbor Megan\* had recently started following Jesus and attending Cru at UCLA. After many long talks with Megan and her Cru friends, Ryan knew that he had found what he was looking for all along—a relationship with Jesus. Today Ryan can't help but tell others his story of how God has made him new. When he compares his life before and after knowing Jesus, it's clear that even Ryan's massive six-foot, seven-inch frame can't contain the overflowing joy of the Lord.

He shares, "I was like the prodigal son. Being welcomed into the Cru community was an embodiment of the Father's warm hug. I have never been happier than I am right now."

## AStudent Impact Story

One morning on a Young Life weekend retreat, I ran into a student wandering around the coffee shop and sat down with him. After chatting with me for a few minutes, he shared that for the last eight years he had been heavily addicted to drugs. Lately he was feeling angry and stuck in life. At that point, the Holy Spirit prompted me to ask, "Would you like a redo?" One thing led to another, and the student ended up deciding to commit his life to Jesus Christ! After some ugly tears, we laughed, hugged, and went on with our weekend.

The next night, on the way home from camp, the student confessed that back at his house he had stashed over a thousand dollars worth of marijuana and shrooms. As we drew closer to his house, I told him that if he was sincere about following Jesus, the Holy Spirit may convict him that he needed to throw the drugs away. After what felt like an eternity, I broke the silence and asked, "Are you ready



to give up the drugs you have hidden in your room?" He responded, "Yeah, I think I am, but I don't think I can do it on my own."

When we got to his house, he invited me in and said, "Hang on a sec." He disappeared into his bedroom, and after a few moments, he returned with a large plastic bag full of drugs and said, "Here, you take it." That student ended up joining one of our small groups and is learning to follow Jesus in deeper and more meaningful ways.

Young Life College at CSUN is an outreach ministry that exists to reach, build, and launch students into a life long relationship with Jesus Christ.



### **HUME CHRISTIAN CAMPS**

When I think of powerful stories of transformation at Hume Christian Camps, there are so many that I could share. 
Joy arrived at Winter Camp as an atheist, seemingly far from God. Within 36 hours, she




left as a devoted follower of Christ. By the grace of God, these are the kinds of stories we see all the time at Hume Christian Camps.


#### **More About Hume Christian Camps**

Founded in 1946, Hume Christian Camps began with a vision to create a place where people could encounter God in a profound and personal way. That first summer 670 campers attended Hume Lake Conferences, supported by 15 volunteer staff. The vision, patience, and labor of these early pioneers birthed what would become a cornerstone of Christian ministry. Since then, more than a million young people and adults have experienced God's love and discovered His wonderful plan for their lives through the programs at Hume Lake.

Now with three locations, Hume Christian Camps has been a beacon of hope and transformation for countless individuals seeking a deeper connection with Jesus Christ. For over seven decades, Hume has been at the forefront of Christian ministry, creating a sanctuary where youth and adults can encounter God in life-changing ways.

In January of 2024, Christian Assembly gave \$75,000 to Hume Christian Camps. In response to this gift, Dr. Boal says, "We are profoundly grateful to CA for their generous gift. With \$25,000, we advanced our due diligence project at Hume SoCal, paving the way for future developments and enhancements. Another \$25,000 allowed us to replace worn-out mattresses at Hume Lake's Ponderosa Camp and provide new Bibles to campers, ensuring they have the resources for a comfortable stay and spiritual growth.

The remaining \$25,000 initiated crucial repairs at our Wagon Train outpost, the chapel where countless children hear the gospel message and come to know Jesus. Christian Assembly's donation allows us to do the work on camp, so that campers can hear the gospel message, deepen their faith, and create lifelong memories."



#### DOOR OF HOPE

## Lily's<sub>Story</sub>

When the domestic abuse that Lily suffered escalated, requiring police intervention, she finally fled with her young sons, and found herself homeless. With no personal savings, work history, or resume, Lily was lost. "I was in a marriage where I solely depended on my husband," she shares.

At that critical moment, Lily discovered Door of Hope—a discovery that changed her life. Working with her case manager and job and career developer, Lily found her passion for medicine. Through comprehensive career guidance, Lily started to turn her plans into reality. She secured three scholarships from Door of Hope, enrolled in educational programs, and obtained licenses as a certified nursing assistant and phlebotomist.

One year after moving into her own permanent housing, Lily is flourishing. She holds a full-time job and is enrolled in UCLA's Medical Assistant Program on a full scholarship, thanks to a Door of Hope partner. With a promising career and a stable, higherpaying job, the future is bright for Lily and her boys, all because she walked through a door of hope.



#### **More About Door of Hope**

Door of Hope is a Christian nonprofit organization with a mission to empower families facing homelessness. We operate four transitional shelters in the Pasadena area that are unique in housing whole families—parents and children together. As they transition from our shelters into their own homes, we provide ongoing case management, therapy, spiritual care, and emergency assistance. In 2023, we sheltered 66 families, and 28 moved into permanent housing.

Serving 204 families in 2023, our Homelessness Prevention Program offers short-term rental assistance, case management, and spiritual care. Our Alumni Support Program promotes long-term stability through continued case management, financial counseling, support groups, Bible study, therapy, and emergency assistance. In total, we served 430 families through our various programs in 2023!

In May of 2024, CA gave a gift of \$20,000 to Door of Hope to help four families who are vulnerable to homelessness. Door of Hope has seen 97 percent of families who graduate from their prevention program remain housed one year later.

### HOPE THE MISSION

## Sheila's Story

Sheila and her son came to Los Angeles from Missouri. After Sheila's job unexpectedly fell through, she and her son lived in hotels until they ran out of money. With nowhere else to go, they ended up on the streets, where they lived in a tent for about eight months and were often in danger. After a city cleanup, Sheila lost everything. Thankfully, she had a friend who connected her with Hope the Mission. With the help of Hope the Mission, her case workers, and with holistic support and job training, Sheila has received the keys to long-term housing. She is one of many who are now off the streets and able to walk in the hope God has for them because of Hope the Mission.

#### **More About Hope the Mission**

Founded in 2009, Hope the Mission is committed to ending homelessness in Los Angeles. The largest rescue mission in the United States, it operates 23 interim housing facilities, providing over 2,700 beds, with 11 additional facilities opening by the end of 2025.

Hope the Mission operates two significant housing sites near Christian Assembly—the Arroyo Seco Tiny Home Community, featuring 114 units and over 200 beds, and the Alvarado Family Shelter, which offers 43 units and 172 beds, exclusively designed for homeless families. Opened in 2023 at the site of a former prostitution hotel, the Alvarado Family Shelter is a beacon of hope, redemption, and healing near McArthur Park.

In 2024, CA re-sponsored 10 tiny homes at \$3,000 each, for a total gift of \$30,000. We also gave an additional \$30,000 to the Alvarado Family Shelter to sponsor 10 family rooms. The plaques on the 10 Tiny Homes and 10 family rooms capture both the heart of Hope the Mission and CA, simply saying, "Done in Jesus' Name (Matthew 25:40)."

## Joanna's Story

Joanna was raised in a Christian home, but she struggled to maintain a relationship with God and didn't really have a spiritual life. She shares, "I knew what I had to do to fix this, but I couldn't bring myself to make things right with God. I sinned constantly and felt guilty all the time. The only prayer I could pray was a prayer for God's grace to find me."

God's grace found Joanna through the YouVersion Bible App in September 2021. In her words, "I feel like God sent the Bible App to me because ever since I downloaded it, I've grown so much closer to Him. He always speaks through the app."


## Tenea's Story

Over time, her husband agreed to attend a church service with her. He cried through the entire service and asked her how to download the Bible App. He started reading the plan on marriage that she recommended, and God used the Bible App to completely transform both of their lives and their marriage.

Tenea adds, "I have grown so much in my faith and have been able to see God's answers to my prayers through my daily study of His Word. I have witnessed God's miracles in my life and my family."

## Dan's Story

Before finding the Bible App, Dan was a believer who only went to God in times of need. He explains, "My relationship with God and His Word was lukewarm. I only ran to God when I was in trouble or on Sundays. God was my fire escape but not the main staircase."

That's when Dan discovered the Bible App, and it completely transformed his relationship with God and how he connected with scripture. As he says, "I have become more confident and conversational with the Lord instead of always asking God to do things for me. My behaviors have changed. I have more clarity on my purpose on earth, and my values are strongly rooted in scripture."

Engaging in different Bible App features helped Dan develop a daily Bible reading habit and discover God's truth through His Word. He adds, "God's Word speaks to me through the Bible App and reveals something new to me every day."

Not only is Dan growing in his knowledge of God's Word, but he gets to read it in his own heart language. He says, "The Bible App has my local language in text and audio Bibles. Now, I'm able to relate to my local community church's teachings more and also learn new words I didn't know in my dialect."

#### **More About YouVersion**

YouVersion is a digital ministry of Life.Church — a multi-site church based in the U.S. that's passionate about helping people access and connect with God's Word around the world. YouVersion is dedicated to encouraging and challenging people to grow closer to God by engaging with Scripture every day.

Since its launch in 2008, the Bible App has offered a free Bible experience to help people deepen their relationship with God. What started out as 83,000 downloads in the first weekend has turned into over half a billion installs worldwide.

Over the past 15 years, YouVersion has become a multi-app ministry, and God is using its Family of Apps—the Bible App, Bible App Lite, and Bible App for Kids—to reach millions of people around the world with His Word.

In January of 2024, CA gave \$411,000 to sponsor what it costs to run YouVersion for 3 days in 2024: Easter Sunday, September 15, and Christmas Day. On Easter Sunday alone, 16.9 million people opened the app to read God's Word.

## Amanda's Story

At age 18, Amanda lacked family support, had financial constraints, and was told by her friends that she was too young to have a baby. Although she expressed a desire to keep her baby at the initial ultrasound appointment, she later told her case manager, Hannah, that she wasn't so sure. "I don't want to bring this baby into a bad situation," she shared.

Hannah listened to all of Amanda's fears and concerns, and the two discussed the resources available to meet Amanda's physical and emotional needs, such as maternity homes if she found herself without housing. "I have needed this kind of guidance my whole life," Amanda responded, "but I've never had it."

Hannah then asked Amanda if she was raised in a particular religion. Amanda said that though she was raised Catholic, she didn't want to rely on an outside power, but instead

Amanda's son was born a few months ago, and she has been faithfully attending Open Arms' parenting classes ever since. She adds, "They helped me know what to do. I can't imagine life without my son, and I'm so glad Open Arms helped me realize how much

This is just one story of many that illustrates the amazing ways that God uses Crescent Project to move in the hearts and lives of many to bless our Muslim friends in Los Angeles in big ways!

Sanah, an Afghan refugee, shared her dreams with me on a two-hour trip to the mountains. Her face lit up as she talked about her hope to one day become an FBI agent, a hope that is far more possible for her in her new country. She explained, "It is my dream to be in law enforcement. A female could never pursue a job like this in Afghanistan, but in the United States, I can!"

Another Christian and I prayed for Sanah right there in the car. When I shared this moment with some other missionary friends, one of them mentioned a family friend, Mike, who is a Christian FBI Agent. We were able to connect Mike with Sanah for a meeting to discuss how Sanah could pursue her dream.

Mike shared his own story and patiently explained all of the paths that could get Sanah into the FBI. One such path was becoming a linguist. Since Sanah knows three languages, the potential for her dream to become a reality grew through this meeting. Who knows how God will continue to direct her steps?

## Tommy Walker **Ministries**

Tommy Walker Ministries exists to declare the gospel through worship and equip others to do the same. Here are a few snapshots of how the grace of God is allowing us to do just that!

Iris, from Atlanta, Georgia, says, "I use your scripture-based music to flow with my scripture-based teaching to those who are incarcerated, both a male and female population. Your music is making a change in me and truly changing the atmosphere at the nine prisons I attend."

A worship leader from Moscow named Andre Berezhnoy created a video from one of our songs called, "The Story Of Your Love." The song explains the story of the gospel, so he translated it and videoed the kids from his church playing and singing it. The video became an effective evangelistic tool for their small Russian church, as they sent it out to their unsaved friends in the area.

Last year we provided a songwriter retreat in Piverone, Italy. A worship leader named

Simona Prota traveled several hours to come and eagerly leaned into the teaching. A few months after we returned, she sent us a beautiful recording of a worship song she wrote from Psalms 130. She said she would teach it to her church, which means, "Mission accomplished!" We want to see more worship songs written by local church worship leaders in their native language.

We have given away over 100,000 worship resources. These have gone out to people from over 80 nations around the world. In recent years, we have traveled throughout the United States, Asia, and Europe, giving worship and songwriting seminars and concerts.

Each of these stories captures the centerpoint of our mission—to declare the gospel through worship and help others to do the same—to the ends of the earth!



#### UNION RESCUE MISSION

Union Rescue Mission is dedicated to serving those experiencing homelessness. It provides emergency and long-term services, which include food, shelter, clothing, medical and dental care, and Christian recovery programs. URM also offers transitional housing, legal assistance, education, counseling, and job training. URM provides an escape from Skid Row and helps guests transition from homelessness to independent living.

#### **URM's HOPE GARDENS FAMILY CENTER**

Hope Gardens offers a peaceful setting and transitional living to moms, children, and single women, as well as permanent supportive housing to senior women. In addition to food and shelter, HGFC has longterm rehabilitation programs, job training, and counseling. Hope Gardens provides the real help women need to escape homelessness forever.

#### CHILDREN'S HUNGER FUND

Children's Hunger Fund equips local churches with Food Paks, boxes of non-perishable food for families in need. Supporters provide Food Paks to churches in the U.S. and around the world. These Food Paks are then delivered to homes. Food becomes a tool for local churches to share the gospel with families in their communities.



#### **ZOE INTERNATIONAL**

ZOE's mission is to reach every person and rescue every child. They seek to reach every person by sharing the gospel and training followers of Jesus Christ. ZOE works to end child trafficking in three ways: prevention, rescue, and restoration.

#### HOVING HOME

The Hoving Home is a nonprofit, residential, faith-based program that serves women who have been involved in drug addiction, alcoholism, prostitution, crime, and other life-controlling problems. The Hoving Home's mission is to provide a loving community devoted to rebuilding shattered lives, and to empower women to fulfill their God-given purpose.

Olive Crest is dedicated to preventing child abuse by strengthening, equipping, and restoring children and families in crisis. The Olive Crest vision is a strong family for every child. Through the power of God, family, and community, Olive Crest helps break the cycle of abuse and empowers children and families to become healthy and productive.

#### PASSION SOCAL NETWORK

Passion SoCal Network reaches hundreds of at-risk students weekly in East LA and South LA through their partnerships and programs. Some of their programs include teaching life skills, emotional health, outreach, discipleship, and leadership development. Their mission is to develop Christian leaders from low-income areas to lead transformative community programs in their cities.

## VALLEY HILLS CHURCH IN GRANADA HILLS

#### **Pastor Sameer Dabit**

At Valley Hills Church, our mission is simple: "We glorify God by helping people in our neighborhood grow into healthy relationships with Jesus and others." Since our launch in September of 2022, we've established strong partnerships with local schools and parks, becoming a well-known presence in our neighborhood. Several of our members serve as sports coaches, which helps connect families and individuals to our community, resulting in salvations and baptisms. We now have an average weekly attendance of 100 people.

A shining example of our outreach is Gabriel, a young man we met at the local park. Gabriel did not grow up in church, but he has become an integral part of our community. He now teaches the ukulele at the park, using his talent to reach families. Gabriel shared, "If it wasn't for this community, I wouldn't have the support that I have now. I am so grateful for Valley Hills."



## VIVID CHURCH IN ORANGE COUNTY

One day after church a man named Mike came up to me and said, "I'm Jewish. I don't agree with what you just preached, but I'm looking for hope. I'll be back next week." The following week, Mike returned and said, "This might be a dumb question, but where do I get a Bible?"

The third week, as I gave an altar call, Mike and his fiancée both raised their hands to receive Jesus as their Savior. After starting to read the Bible, Mike shared with me, "I can't believe more Jews don't believe Jesus is the Messiah. As I read the New Testament, I see Jesus throughout the Old Testament. This is insane!"

Vivid Church was formed to help people like Mike have a crystal clear picture of who Jesus is. Our mission is to make disciples that make disciples. We do this by helping people know God, find freedom, discover their purpose, and make a difference. We have grown to 120 people in nine short months. We have seen over 30 salvations and 40 baptisms!

## ROYAL CITY CHURCH IN INGLEWOOD

In October of 2021, my wife Kyra and I planted Royal City Church in Inglewood, a city that is rapidly growing and continually being redefined. Because of SoFi stadium and the Intuit Dome, Super Bowls, World Soccer Cups, All-Star Games, and the Olympics are being held in our backyard. These events draw people—people who need Jesus. Our mission is to "lead the lost to the light."

In the last two and a half years, we've seen hundreds of people receive Jesus, performed over 300 baptisms in the ocean, provided over 300 backpacks stuffed with school supplies to local children in need, and distributed over 500 hygiene kits to those experiencing homelessness.

Our church launched full-time in the fall of 2024, making the light of Jesus even brighter. We're excited to see what God will do with more of our time, effort, and resources. May He keep "leading the lost to the light."

#### PURPOSE LA IN NORTH HOLLYWOOD

#### **Pastor Darryl Speers**

We moved to LA in 2020 to serve the most vulnerable population during Covid-19. We started out working at food pantries and other nonprofits in the city. My wife Tracy began collaborating with anti-human trafficking organizations and eventually became the director of After Hours Ministry, which supports women who have been sexually exploited and trafficked in Los Angeles.

When we officially launched our church in January of 2024, we continued our mission work and encouraged our congregation to engage with their communities. We were given an old, run-down church, which we have gradually remodeled. We are also transforming one of the buildings into a resource center for women escaping trafficking, complete with emergency shelters, beds, showers, a kitchen, a laundry room, a clothing closet, and a food distribution center.

When we launched our church, we started with 33 people. Our current average weekly attendance is now 85. We offer children's ministry, youth ministry, and are in the process of starting a recovery ministry. We have also baptized seven new believers.

In 2024, CA gave \$10,000 towards each of these church plants.

### **COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL**

## Lune Ray's Story

Every Saturday six-year-old June Ray and more than 300 other sponsored children gather at the Compassion child development center in Taruc (a small mountain community off the Sibuguey Bay in the Philippines). They come for their weekly learning activities, but also for one essential reason—to enjoy free-flowing water. It is only at the center that they experience the joy of drinking, washing, and taking a shower without worrying that supply might run out.

Diarrhea, upset stomach, and skin rashes are common health problems encountered by tribal families living around this mountain community. Water sources are natural mountain springs, but they are few and far between, several miles away from each other. Although the local government has provided artesian wells, pipes, and hoses in some areas, the well water and poorly maintained pipes contain harmful pathogens when used for everyday living. And some homes are difficult to reach, leaving hundreds without a nearby water source.

In November 2023, Sea Gentiles for Christ Ministries, a Compassion child development center located in this remote mountain village, dug a new well and constructed a water system on a hillside near the church. The new borehole and the installation of a water pump, an elevated water tank, and a set of pipes and hoses were made possible because of Christian Assembly's generosity and partnership with Compassion International.

Joseph, the pastor of Sea Gentiles for Christ Ministries, says, "I am grateful for Compassion and Christian Assembly, for coming here, for giving help. I am really thankful to the Lord that many children will benefit from this water system."

June Ray is just one of Compassion's sponsored children whose life has been directly impacted by the gift of the water system. He helps his father and sister fetch water every day from the new well, although he can only carry two one-liter water containers.



"He helps us in any way he can," says Mercy, June Ray's mom. "He also knows how to have fun and studies hard."

Children, families, and church staff alike share in the joy of this new water system. "We are very grateful to Compassion for giving us this wonderful blessing," says Donnie, the center's director. "It is indeed an answered prayer for all of us. Thank you so much, because in this way we can provide clean and safe water to all the children."

June Ray continues to fetch water from the center's well every day, but Joseph and Donnie are determined to continue to find ways to make clean water even more accessible to local families. Before the water system was installed, Compassion helped the church purchase water filters and distributed them to several children, including June Ray. The church also recently bought a second tank and plans to put up a system of pipes and hoses so that the water can reach more homes.

Since the installation of the water system, the church has built three satellite centers that serve a total of 319 Compassion children. "If there is anything I am proud of, it's the dedicated servanthood of our church members. They are doing things with their whole hearts and are generous towards others who are not yet part of our church. We all share the same desire: to know God more and make Him known," says Donnie.

Please continue to pray for Sea Gentiles for Christ Ministries, its leaders, church members, Compassion participants, and community members. Pray that God would continue to shower them with His goodness, kindness, and loving mercy. May God bring help and times of refreshing, as they seek to know God and make Him known.

#### More Compassion International Projects Funded by Christian Assembly

Christian Assembly's partnership with Compassion International continues to expand. In 2024, CA gave \$361,937 towards clean water projects, Bible distribution, and discipleship in Ethiopia, Columbia, and Uganda. These projects worked with 19 local churches to serve the poor and vulnerable in Jesus' name. With all the projects combined, the estimated number of people served is 20,144! Take a look at the numbers below to get a better idea of the ongoing impact of CA's partnership with Compassion!

In Ethiopia, the projects impacted 6,279 people (1,365 sponsored children and their families).

In Columbia, the projects impacted 1,265 people (408 sponsored children and their families).

In Uganda, the projects impacted 12,600 people (800 sponsored children and their families and an additional 2,000 families from neighboring churches).

# The Stories of Felix Flovia by Juli Bott

It was a hot, sunny day in 2008 in the small, rural village of Chebaiywa. For three years, our 10-member team of healthcare providers and grassroots leaders had been trying to love our neighbors through seemingly simple tasks—visiting the homes of the sick, providing a meal, attending funerals, and caring for the orphans left behind. What was in front of us was death without dignity death with stigma, isolation, and loneliness. Our schedule for this day included two home visits for two children who were dying. One lay on the floor of a mud hut kitchen. One was carried in his mother's arms. Their names were Felix and Flovia, and their little lives caused us to ask the question, "What does it look like to love in this situation?"

The emaciated bodies and desperate cries of Felix and Flovia stirred our team with a compassion that would not be satisfied until

it was put into action. By God's grace, Felix and Flovia found themselves surrounded by a community who chose to stand in faith and respond, "let's try," even in the face of seemingly insurmountable challenges. We started Felix and Flovia on a special formula and fed them every two hours, day and night. Within days, they began to grow. At two-and-a-half years old, Flovia, no more than 15 pounds, learned to walk and speak in two languages. With her playful spirit, she captured hearts. Felix was a one-year-old who weighed a mere nine pounds. What a beautiful sound it was when he first laughed. To our great loss, after six weeks of treatment, Felix went into respiratory failure and passed away. His death left a void within all who had the privilege of caring for him. While we deeply grieved Felix's death, we joyously celebrated Flovia's life.

Our experience of taking care of Felix and Flovia—one who passed away and one who came back to life—revealed to us the unique opportunity we had to provide care, knowing the outcomes are out of our hands. This is what we knew mattered. Felix and Flovia were surrounded by a community that carried them and amplified their still, small voices while on this earth. The faithful response, "Let's try," mattered, and became the seed that would grow into the mission and vision of Living Room.

As Living Room marks 15 years of official existence, we pause to remember that hot, sunny day in 2008. We remember tiny Felix lovingly held in his mother's arms. His big, brown eyes. His laughter. Though his life ended too soon, his story continues. We remember the little life of Flovia, lying on the mud floor of her grandmother's kitchen, dying. Her story also continues. Flovia is now 18 years old, in her final year of high school. She smiles, laughs, sings, works diligently in school, welcomes people, cares for others, and knows that she is deeply loved. She has been given the gift to dream. Her current dream is to study nursing and counseling after she graduates from high school in November.

All of this causes us to wonder. Do Felix and Flovia know how tightly woven their stories are with the birth of a community that has now given hope to hundreds of thousands? Do they know that the gift of their lives has inspired this community to keep diligently seeking to try? Do they know that their stories have given thousands of others a chance to re-write their stories, from pain and suffering to life and refuge? They may never fully grasp just how far-reaching the gift of their lives truly are, and the community and legacy they inspired—a community committed to love deeply, care sincerely, and try—no matter the odds, no matter the outcome.

## More About Living Room International

In 2009, Living Room International was created to meet the needs of the seriously ill in Western Kenya. For over 15 years, Living Room has been a life-giving and transformative refuge for people throughout Kenya. Living Room has worked side-by-side with other Kenyans to build two hospices/hospitals, a home-based care program, and a funeral home. Living Room serves over 100,000 Kenyans per year between its two sites.

In a new development, Living Room plans to build a three-story designated Outpatient Care Center. The Outpatient Care Center will house emergency medicine services, outpatient medical consultation and specialty clinics, eye and dental clinics, radiology services, physical therapy services, a laboratory, a pharmacy, and a comprehensive cancer unit. Once completed, it is estimated that the center will serve 250 people per day in Jesus' name. As soon as the building permits are approved in Kenya, Christian Assembly plans to give \$1 million towards this new project to help turn it into a reality.

Carlos had been denied access to many shelters and recovery centers because of his condition and not being able to work. When he showed up at La Roca, he immediately began pleading with Pastor Andres and I to help him.

Andres looked at me and said, "I know what this will involve, but we are willing to do whatever it takes." So, I said, "Let's do it, for this is the reason why God has raised this ministry-to help those who find themselves in desperate situations."

A short time later, I ran into Carlos at church. He was so grateful for the ministry that he said, "I don't want any more help. You and the others have helped me so much! I want to serve and become part of the church. I know God can use me just as I am." I told Carlos that he is welcome to be part of the family, and I can't wait to see how God is going to use him!

## The Leadership Tree

"Who's on your Tree?" is a question regularly asked in Young Life International. It refers to who you are investing in, and who they are investing in. Jesus had 12 disciples, but he especially invested in Peter, James, and John. The challenge for leaders and staff in Young Life Central and Eastern Europe is to invest in three people, who invest in three more, who invest in three more. In this way, disciples make disciples, who make disciples, who make disciples. For 20 years, Al and Stacy Anderson (CA Kingdom Partners) have been living out this discipleship model and have seen tremendous growth stemming from their leadership trees.

One of the three on Stacy's tree is a National Trainer for Young Life in Poland named Jarzynka. Jarzynka equips and trains new staff in Young Life, and also trains university student staff, like Zosia, through the Developing Global Leaders Program. Zosia was a Young Life kid, who then became a Developing Global Leader (DGL). Through the DGL program, Zosia was mentored and trained by Jarzynka in personal and spiritual development, but also in ministry skills and

Zosia is now on staff and leads other DGLs and volunteers in reaching out to teenagers in Poland. Jarzynka also works with Pawel and Kasia, a newly-married couple who have a passion for young people to have living relationships with Jesus. For the past year, Jarzynka has been equipping them to lead a ministry team, as they continue to courageously share Jesus' love with adolescents in their part of the city.

One of the three on Al's tree is Dominik, the Country Director of Young Life Poland, who has a passion for the youth in his country to know Jesus personally. He and his wife Asia knew Martyna from their church community for years. Martyna was a school teacher whose

heart was breaking for the kids in her school who were struggling with anxiety, loneliness, and depression, so Dominik invited Martyna to visit some Young Life weekends. She immediately saw this ministry as a place to invite young people to have fun, develop friendships, and hear how much Jesus loves them.

Martyna is now on staff and leading teams of volunteers who reach out to middle and high school students in her city. They run Bible studies for the kids who are going deeper in faith, and continue to invite new young people into this community, where they can find friendship and the hope they are desperately seeking. Dominik is investing in Martyna and her leadership in her community, as she invests in leaders on her own tree, and together they reach out to students in Lusowo, Poland.



This is a glimpse of how investing in a few people, who invest in a few people, who invest in a few people, makes an incredible impact. In fact, Al and Stacy got connected to Jarzynka and Dominik because of one of the first kids they met when they moved to Ostrava, Czech Republic in 2004. Twenty years ago the Andersons discipled a high school student named Tyna and later developed her as a leader. Tyna did an internship at Christian Assembly for a few months while in university, and later answered God's call to start Young Life in Poland. There she met and developed Dominik and Jarzynka and handed off the ministry to them when she eventually moved back to the Czech Republic.

When the Andersons first moved in 2004, ministry was happening in one country in this part of the world—the Czech Republic. Since then, the ministry has kept branching out. Today, ministry is happening in nine countries, and 40 staff are working with 300 volunteers within these countries. Each of those people has a Leadership Tree and are investing in three people, and giving them the vision to invest in three, who will invest in three. The volunteers and staff around Central Europe and the Balkans know 5,000 students right now. As each of those volunteers and staff continue to invest in three more, who invest in three more, you can imagine what an impact that discipleship will have on this part of the world in another 20 years!

Eyosiyas Tsegaye grew up in a Christian family. His father was even a pastor. Eyosiyas' family helped to build the foundation for his spiritual journey. However, it was only after he started actively participating in his high school student fellowship that Eyosiyas' faith became his own.

After high school, Eyosiyas went on to study textile engineering, and his faith and leadership just kept growing. As he had done in high school, Eyosiyas played various leadership roles in his university's campus Christian fellowship, equipped by EvaSUE. ## WILD HOPE INTERNATIONAL IN TANZANIA William Keiya's Story



"Africans are the ones who will change Africa." We say this often around Wild Hope. William is one of the Africans changing Africa. We know this, because we know William and his family well.

William's family was not well-off when he was growing up. They moved frequently along the Rift Valley floor with their cows, seeking new pastures and patrons to help them make ends meet. In 1993, they moved near Entashata, where we started our outreach.

William's father Menye Tito Lai came to the small church on the front porch of our adobe house. After two years of teaching and Bible study, he gave his life to the Lord. God immediately delivered him from a lifelong addiction to alcohol, and he and his wife Anna dedicated their family—now with five kids—to the Lord.



After we moved to Tanzania, my wife Tammy invited Anna to become one of the founding members of the Wild Hope Artisans. She made beautiful works of art out of the traditional beads for which the Massai are famous. Anna noticed that her third-born, William, was excelling in the local school, so she used her newfound income to get him educated, turning beads into opportunities for her son.

William thrived in both elementary and secondary boarding schools, but he also grew spiritually. At an Easter Christian Students Conference, his life changed forever. William shares, "I had grown up in a Christian home, but I knew Christ was calling me personally. I came up at the altar call. I was so hungry for Jesus!"

From that day on, a voracious hunger for the Word of God and a new confidence welled up in William. He spoke at Christian gatherings at his school. After graduating first in his class, William accepted a spot at the Dar es Salaam Institute of Technology in the School of Mining and Geology. He soon rose to the top of his class, and he became Co-Chairman of the Student Fellowship at the University, leading outreaches into surrounding neighborhoods.

After graduation, William was hired at the ruby mine 40 kilometers away from his home. On any given work day, he can be found 1,000 feet down a shaft of an industrial ruby mine, ensuring compliance to safety procedures for blasting and transport teams. But his real love is ministry. He started "The Father's Heart Ministry" (a ministry to widows and orphans), and has risen in the leadership of Young Life Tanzania. Last year William was invited to teach at Young Life's convocation in Morogoro, where 1,200 leaders gathered, and he will teach again this year.

Praise God for William's dad, who bowed to Christ and brought up his children in a Christian home. Praise God for his mom, who tirelessly worked with her hands to get him educated. Praise God for William's faithfulness, as he seeks to see Tanzanian young people—a truly unreached people group—transformed with the love of Christ!

## FAR EAST BROADCASTING COMPANY IN VIETNAM

## Mr. N's Story

In the bustling metropolis of Ho Chi Minh City, Mr. N lived the life of a young, ambitious Vietnamese man. A university student majoring in computer science, he found the academic challenges too mild to satisfy his sharp intellect. Instead, he poured his energy into his job as a lead programmer at a gaming company, where the digital realms he created offered him some semblance of fulfillment.

Born into a Buddhist family, Mr. N considered himself an atheist, disinterested in spiritual discourses and skeptical of all things unseen. Life in Vietnam, a country with strict controls on religious expression and limited access to diverse theological perspectives, meant that Mr. N had little exposure to ideas outside the state-sanctioned norm. This environment shaped his worldview, leaving little room for spiritual curiosity—until a seemingly mundane gift transformed his life.

A friend, knowing his penchant for technology, gave Mr. N a speaker box loaded with audio files. The first message he heard was a simple yet profound declaration: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." (Genesis 1:1) These words struck a chord deep within Mr. N. He had never encountered the concept of a Creator. Intrigued, he began a solitary journey of scripture exploration, guided by the Far East Broadcasting Company (FEBC) mobile apps that streamed hours of gospel content into his once skeptical heart.

Among these programs was "The Story," a series of messages from Christian Assembly that detailed the narrative of the Bible in a compelling and accessible way. Over the next two years, Mr. N's casual interest in the Bible transformed into a profound quest for truth. He devoured the gospel, the stories of Jesus, and the teachings of the apostles. He eventually sought out a community of believers, and one day—alone in the quiet of his room—he prayed to receive Christ. The impact was immediate and transformative. He confessed, "I'm becoming a new and different person."

Mr. N soon became a beacon of faith to his family, leading his mother and siblings to Christ through the very speaker box that "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." (Genesis 1:1)

His story is a testament to the power of the gospel to transcend boundaries and change lives in even the most restricted environments, proving that when the truth of God's Word reaches a seeking heart, it can indeed lead to profound and eternal impact.

## Karon's Story

Karon, a national partner who is a powerful evangelist and disciple-maker, showed up in an all-Muslim village to the house of Sali, to whom he had recently given a Bible. Sali said how interesting it was that the same story about Jesus was repeated in multiple books of the Bible. It was apparent that he hadn't just read a chapter or two, but he had been reading large sections of the gospels. He retold the stories to Karon as if re-enacting parts of a movie. Sali had clearly been deeply touched by Jesus through the reading of the Word.

The very first time Karon came to Sali's house, Sali was lying down because his right side was paralyzed from an issue with his blood pressure. Karon laid his hands on Sali in prayer, and Sali was able to sit up. Eventually, Sali was able to walk again, and when Karon came to deliver a couch as a gift, Sali helped

Karon bring it into the house! His whole household, including his wife and daughters, have since given their lives to Jesus.

Sali is just one example of many people who have been touched by Karon's ministry. Karon goes to many houses as a part of our team of national partners who go to unreached Muslim villages with the message of the good news of Jesus. Every Monday Karon comes to our office and shares a powerful story of transformation. Sometimes it is a person who has been delivered from demons. Other times it is an entire family who prays to receive Christ together, and other times it is a husband and wife who experience reconciliation in their marriage. But there is one common thread in all of these stories. God is working in Central Asia to lead people to complete commitment to Jesus Christ.

Our team of national partners has experienced intense persecution this past year, including harassment by the government and even physical violence. But despite these difficulties, God has been gracious to us, and we still continue to witness His goodness in Muslim villages in Central Asia.



The Bennetts serve in Central Asia in a country that is 98 percent Muslim and over 95 percent mountains. They have lived in the region for almost 10 years and are now leading a large team of foreigners and locals who go out into the villages and lead discovery Bible studies and do community development projects. The goal is to see holistic transformation in villages, so that people in these communities have access to food, freedom, and forgiveness. The ministry has helped to build medical clinics, repair roads, buy desks for a school, and bring practical help to many villages. Discovery Bible studies teach villagers to ask simple questions in order to understand the Word of God. There are currently over 50 discovery Bible study groups learning the Word of God. Since the beginning of 2024, 32 people have prayed to receive Christ. Over the past several years, the ministry has helped lead several hundred people to pray to receive Christ.

## Setareh Tells<sub>Her</sub> Story



After completing Elam's church-planting course, my husband and I were invited to plant a church in a city outside of Iran. We were so excited to use our training to share the gospel, but it was not what I expected. There were very few fellow Iranians and an estimated 17,000 Afghan refugees in the city at the time.

Although I might not have admitted it, I didn't like Afghans or their culture. I felt no connection with them. For six months we tried to share the gospel with Afghans, but it was as if the heavens were closed over this city. So we listened to wise counsel from our mentors and got on our knees to pray.

That's when I had a dream. I was walking in a dark place. Suddenly, a colorful feather floated down and led me to a worshiping crowd of Afghans. Somebody called my name, encouraging me to join the worship. Then the fire of the Lord fell upon the crowd. I immediately realized this dream was from God.

We fasted, asking God to fulfill the dream. On the third day of our fast, I received a call from a stranger. A female voice on the line said, "Are you Christian? I'm tired of my religion." The caller was an Afghan, and she and her family wanted to come to our church.

And so it began. This family joined our church and confessed faith in Jesus. Soon a handful of other Afghan families also came The mission of Elam Ministries is to strengthen and expand the church in the Iran region and beyond. Over more than three decades of ministry, hundreds of thousands of Iranians have come to Christ. We are so grateful to Christian Assembly for being part of the beautiful story God is writing among Persian-speaking people!

As the church grew, we needed a bigger place to meet, but when we went to view properties, we were told, "Don't waste your time; we don't want a church here." We were rejected from 40 locations. All we could do was pray more.

Then God did a miracle and gave us an apartment. It was on the highest floor of a tall building, so that we could see the whole city as we worshiped and prayed. More people started coming. Lives were changed. Physical healings took place, and marriages were restored. People invited Jesus into every facet of their lives. At one baptismal service, 17 Afghans were baptized!

Today some of my closest friends are Afghans. In Galatians 3:28 it says, "There is no longer Jew or Greek." We are all one in Jesus. God taught me that there is no longer Iranian or Afghan. What a privilege that He wants to use Iranians like me to help Afghan people to know Him!

## Returning GoodforEvil

What seemed to be an evil plan was turned into an opportunity to glorify God.

The Ikare Community in Nigeria is a large area with a population of about 5,000 people. One of their crucial needs is medical care, because there is no clinic to serve the sick. After we conducted a medical outreach in the community, helping over 2,000 people with various illnesses, the community requested assistance in establishing a clinic. They even donated a building for this purpose. We immediately sent qualified community health workers, and soon many people were benefiting from the medical services, with some even converting to Christianity.

However, the Muslims in the larger neighboring communities were unhappy. They were angry that people were turning to faith in Jesus. Some fanatic Muslims fabricated lies and reported to the police that our clinic was performing unlawful medical practices and that many people were being killed. The next day a heavy presence of the Nigerian Police arrived in Ikare to arrest the health workers and close down the clinic.


Upon their arrival, the police were warmly welcomed by our health workers, who gave them a tour of the clinic. The leaders of Ikare Community informed the police of how helpful the clinic had been. The police soon realized that they had been misled. During the visit, the health supervisor conducted a quick blood pressure check for the policemen, discovering that the most senior officer had a blood pressure reading of 200 over 120. The supervisor immediately provided medical assistance to stabilize his condition, potentially saving his life.

#### **More About Bakari Ibrahim Bunga**

Bakari Ibrahim Bunga is a CA Kingdom Partner in West Africa with Evangelical Church Winning All (ECWA) and City Ministries. Christian Assembly supports Bakari, along with 20 church planters, who lead people to Christ amidst immense persecution and suffering. Bakari has been a key leader in a movement that has seen thousands come to Christ in West Africa. In many ways, Bakari is a modern day hero in the faith, as he continues to lead others to advance the Kingdom of God in the midst of persecution.

After experiencing the love and kindness of the clinic, the sick police chief and some of the policemen converted to Christianity right there at the clinic. The police gathered the community and instructed that anyone attempting to cause trouble for the clinic and its staff would be jailed. Now, both the staff and the clinic are safe. What seemed to be an evil plan was turned into an opportunity to glorify God.

Now we are trusting God for funds to build a bigger healthcare facility in the community and even the surrounding Muslim communities as well. Other communities have already donated some pieces of land where we can build more clinics. May God continue to return good for evil in order that Christ may be glorified!

### ABOUT KINGDOM MINISTRIES AT CHRISTIAN ASSEMBLY CHURCH

## What is the "Kingdom" value of Christian Assembly Church?

Jesus is the King of Kings (see 1 Timothy 6:15, Revelation 19:16), and the Kingdom of God is a central theme in His teachings. When we use the term Kingdom, we are talking about sharing God's transforming grace with others around us, in the city, and around the world, just as God shared it with us in His Son, Jesus Christ. This includes both acts of mercy and justice, as well as verbally telling people about Jesus Christ and how they can be saved by grace through faith in His life, death, and resurrection. Want to read for yourself what Jesus has to say about the Kingdom of God? Check out Mark 1:15, Matthew 6:10, Matthew 6:33, or all of Matthew 13. Another set of foundational verses for us in this area is 2 Corinthians 5:17-20.

## Why does CA have both LOCAL and GLOBAL kingdom efforts?

Jesus told His disciples, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) So that meant in their local city, their surrounding region/state, and to the ends of the earth. We follow the model given to us in Jesus' words, which engage us in both local and global efforts.

## Why does CA seek to ensure that all of our efforts include both telling the good news of Jesus and demonstrating it?

Jesus ministered to the whole person—body, mind, soul, and spirit—and so we seek to follow that same practice. In fact, Jesus told his original disciples: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and

teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20) So clearly there is a spoken evangelism, a teaching, and a discipleship component to the mission of Jesus.

Likewise, Jesus was clear that acts of compassion, justice, and mercy were critical parts of His mission. In Matthew 25, He specifically includes tangible acts such as feeding the hungry, giving a drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, taking care of the sick, and more, as ways of living out the values of the Kingdom of God. He even goes so far to say, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40)

## How can I be involved in the LOCAL efforts that are happening?

Serving is one of the best ways to be part of all that God is doing! In fact, I would say that getting involved in the mission by serving is one of the best ways to grow your relationship with God. Jesus said that the greatest in the Kingdom would be a servant of all. (Matthew 20:26-28) If you want to find out more about serving locally, visit our website (cachurch.com) or scan the QR code.
